Born 6/17/1950 to Arthur and Lillian Velasquez in Del Norte Colorado. Graduated from Del Norte high school in 1969. He joined the Air Force after graduating from high school. He was also a medic in the Army National Guard and member of the color guard and expert marksman. He served as the chairman of Migrant Council, taught Catechism, he had a good work ethic, often working 2 jobs, he worked at the following places: retail, managed Loaf 'N Jug. He was the Landfill Supervisor/heavy equipment operator for Rio Grande County, logger, moonlighted selling life and health insurance where he earned awards as Rookie of the year and Tapper of the year, Douglas Studs Lumber Mill, Summitville mine, Interstate Electric, Adams State College, and his last job was with Xcel Energy. Anthony and his wife Judi owned a restaurant (Los Dos) at several locations in Del Norte and Alamosa. His restaurant was awarded the Sergeant Major's Award July of 1988 for outstanding service when feeding the National Guard troops during a two-week training exercise. He was an excellent cook.
