Alamosa resident Celestina Gonzales, 99, went home to be with the Lord on August 26, 2018 at the San Luis Care Center with her loving family by her side. Celestina was welcomed into the world on July 30, 1919 in Conejos, Colorado, the third daughter of Meliton Velasquez and Elena Salazar Velasquez. She married Manuel Gonzales of Alamosa, CO in 1937. That same year they made Alamosa, CO their home. Celestina grew up and attended high school in La Jara, CO and was even her class valedictorian. She is known by her nephew's and niece's as "Aunt Sally". Celestina always claimed to have two retirements. She worked 32 years at JC Penny's where she earned the title of head cashier and bookkeeper. After retiring from JC Penny's she took a secretary position at Boyd Elementary School.
