the Del Norte school district teaching English as a second language to students of all grades.

She also had a love for all things homemade, like tortillas, jams & jellies, and she loved tackling

DIY projects of all kinds. While she didn't always enjoy cooking, she provided countless memorable meals for her family, bringing everyone together for gatherings filled with love and

laughter. She was famous for her love of chocolate cake for breakfast and Rice Crispy

treats at
any time.

Georgia was born into a large, loving family, one of twelve children. She was preceded in
death

by her parents, Ubaldo and Felicita Esquibel; her brothers, Felipe, Toby, and Iram; her
sisters,

Joann and Annabell; and nieces Lisa Duran Atencio, Toni Alarid Garcia and one nephew
