"Just have some beer and a bottle ready when I get to town, make sure it's cold too".

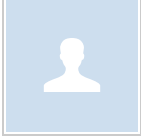
Ray was a hard worker and was always willing to lend a helping hand. He was there through good and bad times. We shared many conversations of life, love, dreams and our mistakes and failures.
